



Jose Martinez Fabre is currently serving as the Executive Director for Budget, Office of Finance (OF), at the U.S. Customs and Border Protections (CBP). For the past 2 of his 17 years of federal service, Mr. Martinez Fabre has overseen the administration of CBP's total \$18B in budget authority to ensure the efficient and effective use of funds. This has included budget formulation, execution, control, and monitoring of all activity involving the CBP budget, appropriations, and expenditure of funds; preparation of Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and Congressionally-required budgetary reports; preparation for hearings; coordination and review of apportionments, reappropriations and allotments; and negotiation of funding levels with OMB and Senior Leadership.

Before becoming the Executive Director for CBP Budget, Mr. Martinez Fabre served as the Deputy Director for the Mission Support Division, CBP's Office of Human Resources Management (HRM). During his tenure at HRM, Mr. Fabre led and supported the management of key functional areas to enable the operation of CBP's human resources infrastructure. These areas included budget formulation and execution, contracts and procurement, facilities, property, and human capital.

Prior to joining HRM, Mr. Martinez Fabre served as the Assistant Director for the Trade and Travel Facilitation Branch in OF, Budget. In this capacity, Mr. Martinez Fabre was responsible for overseeing and supporting the budget formulation and execution for the Offices of Field Operations, Trade, Commissioner, Public Affairs, International Affairs, and Congressional Affairs. Prior to his role as Assistant Director, Mr. Martinez Fabre served as Branch Chief for User Fees, Cost Management Division. In this role, Mr. Martinez Fabre was responsible for forecasting revenue collections, formulating budget requests, and co-leading the User Fee Advisory Committee.

Before joining CBP, Mr. Martinez Fabre was a Senior Consultant for IBM where he supported projects in the FAA, USAID, and CBP. His areas of consulting focused on business process reengineering and the development of financial systems. He started his career as a federal employee at the Government Accountability Office where he served as a Senior Analyst for the International Affairs and Trade Team. In this capacity, he worked on the development of a series of reports on financial services, and trade and foreign affairs as requested by Congress.

Mr. Martinez Fabre attended the University of Puerto Rico where he completed a BA in Economics (Cum Laude). He completed his Master's degree and doctoral work in the fields of Political Economy, International Relations and Public Policy at the State University of New York in Albany, Rockefeller Institute. As part of his academic work, Mr. Martinez Fabre was invited to the University of Brasilia in

Brazil as a junior research fellow to conduct research on the formulation of industrial policy in Brazil. Additionally, during his time in Albany, Mr. Fabre worked for the New York State Senate and Assembly as adjunct professor in the field of Macroeconomics.
